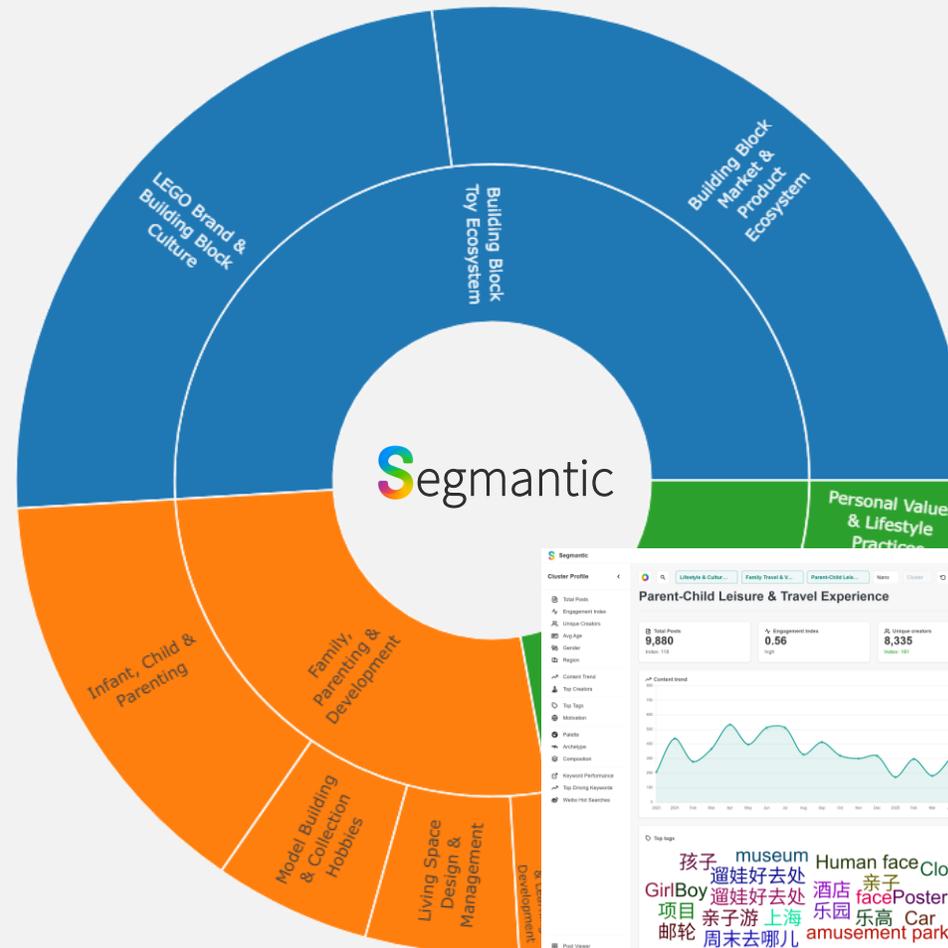

PERMISSION TO PLAY & THE GENTRIFICATION OF BLOCK BASED TOYS

- The Block Based Toy taxonomy shows that LEGO and other block-based toys are being "gentrified" by young adults to fit into an adult, productivity-obsessed lifestyle.
- We need play like we need sleep, but how we play changes as we grow. From Miniforce toys and Lego to Honor of Kings and NBA.
- The data indicate that young Chinese adults on RedNote have developed a 'vocabulary of motive' to normalize their play with block-based toys and avoid the danger of looking childish & unproductive.

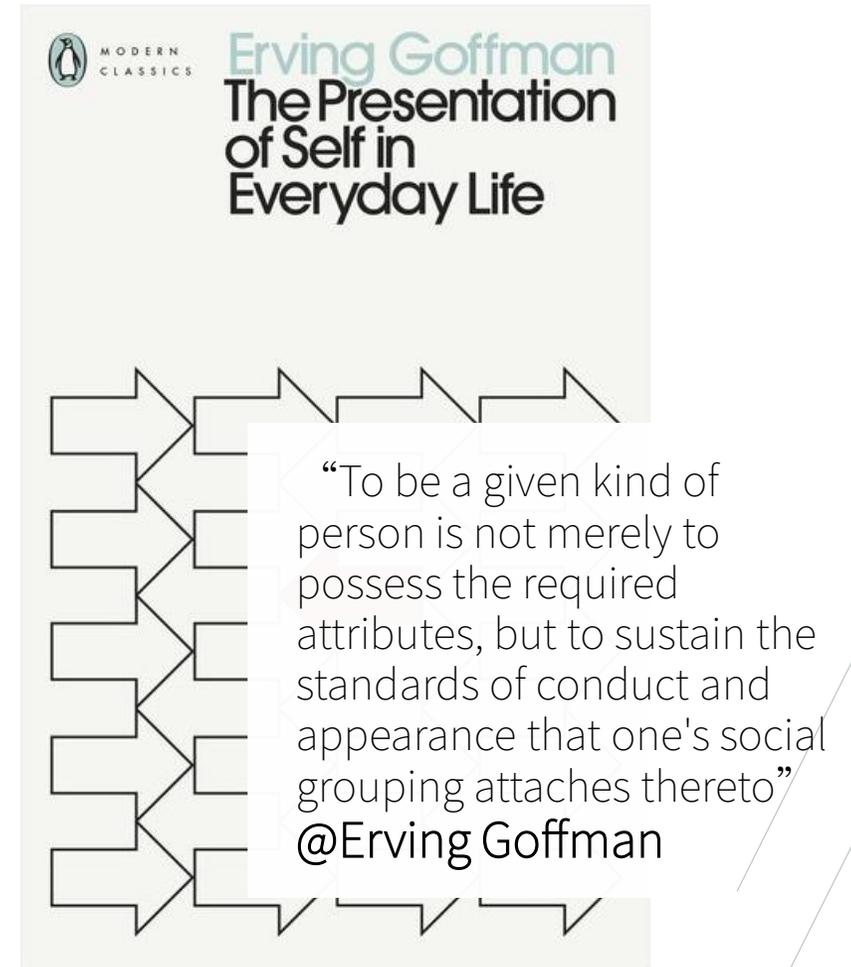

WHY DO CHINESE YOUNG ADULTS NEED A VOCABULARY OF MOTIVE TO PLAY?

- According to Sociologist Erving Goffman adulthood is a performance. We are constantly on "stage" trying to maintain a consistent character.
- "Childishness" is a *Performance Failure*, a crack in the mask. If an adult shows they are prone to fantasy or playing with toys, they are telling others that they are unpredictable, unreliable.
- If you play with toys, can you be trusted with a budget? The “vocabulary of motive” is what Goffman calls "Face Work." A repair mechanism used to correct the "crack" in the performance.



'ACTING CHILDISH' SIGNALS A DEVELOPMENTAL FAILURE IN THE WEST, BUT A MORE SERIOUS MORAL FAILURE IN CHINA

- The fear that "looking childish" signals a lack of control is universal – as true in Milan as Shenzhen. But between China and the West, it signals a different flaw.
- In the West, 'acting like a child' is seen as a Developmental Failure- you are "stuck" in the past. In China, it is viewed as a Moral Failure; you are "negligent" in the present.
- For a Chinese young adult, playing with toys is a Moral Risk, not just social awkwardness- therefore, a toy must perform a "Job" to save the owner's face.

- The Western Idiom -

If you act like a child, you get treated as a child

Diagnosis: **Development failure**

Risk: **Look silly/naive**

- The Chinese Idiom -

Pursuit of petty pleasures thwarts high aims¹

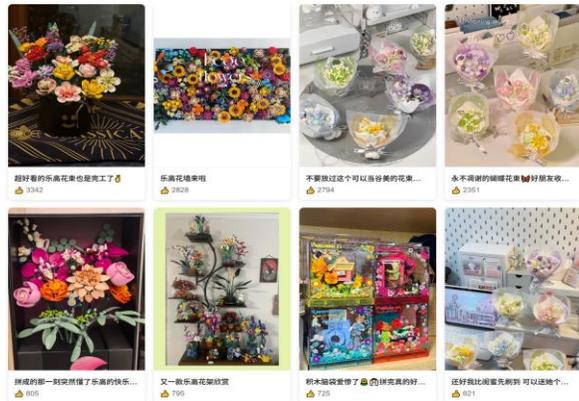
Diagnosis: **Moral Failure**

Risk: **Look unreliable/useless**

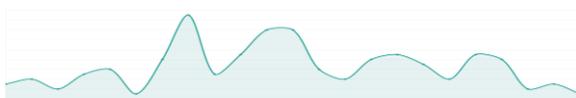

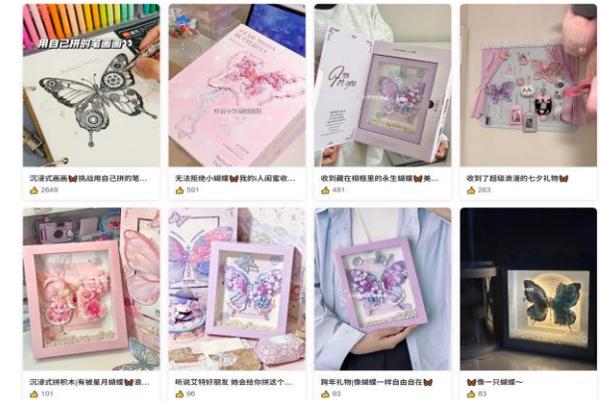

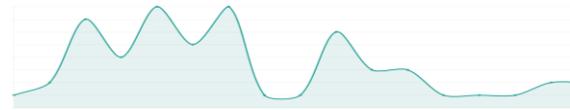

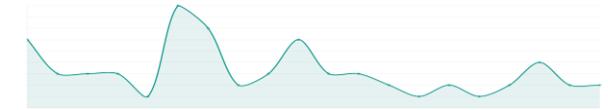

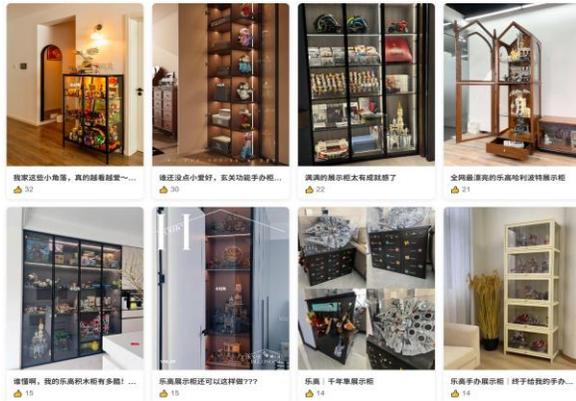

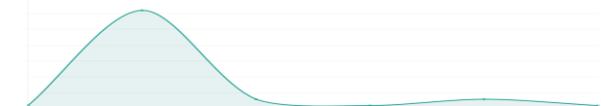

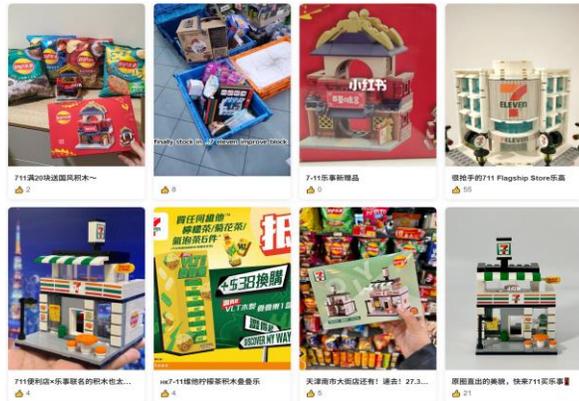

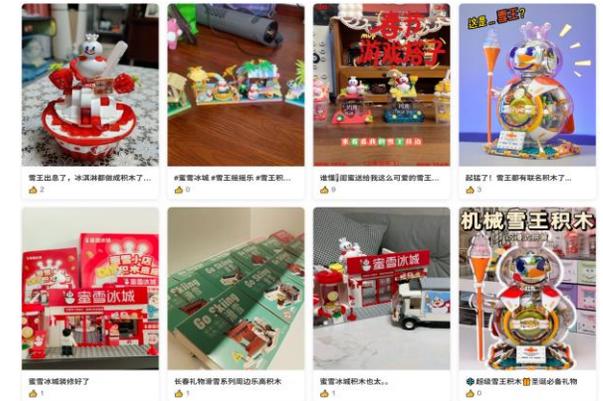

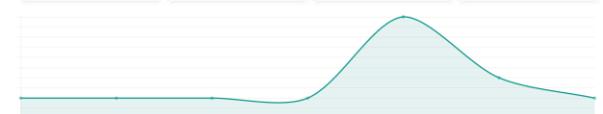

BRAND IMPLICATIONS: STOP DESIGNING FOR THE INNER CHILD, DESIGN FOR THE OUTER ADULT.

- The more "**child-coded**" the medium (plastic bricks, dolls vs. pixels, balls), the heavier the "**Social Alibi**" required to buy, play, share.
- If the adult consumer's fear is looking immature, Every product **feature must serve as a shield** against that anxiety.
- You can't just "age up" the content. You **must "category shift" the object** by leaning into the six alibis seen in the 'vocabulary of motive'.
